UPDATE FOR OLD CROW RESIDENTS

- **86%** of residents have been fully vaccinated
- **95%** of residents have had one dose of the vaccine

There are **no** confirmed cases in Old Crow.

COVID-19 COMMUNITY EMERGENCY ACT REMAINS IN EFFECT IN OLD CROW

Please continue:

- Wearing a mask inside public buildings;
- Gathering **only** with people in your two-household bubble;
- Isolating for 2 weeks when entering Old Crow **if** you're not fully vaccinated;
- **Immediately** self-isolating and calling the Nursing Station at **966-4444** if you feel sick.

BOOSTER SHOTS FOR ELDERS 50+

Elders who are 50 and older are now eligible to get a booster shot, six months after their second vaccine. A clinic will be held in Old Crow in the coming weeks.

Booster shot appointments in Whitehorse are full, but the clinic at the Yukon Convention Centre is open for drop-ins. They are open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 9 am to 4:30 pm, and Wednesday from 12 to 7 pm. More appointments for booster shots in Whitehorse will be added next week.

PROOF-OF-VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

Starting **November 30**, Yukoners who are 12+ will need to show proof of vaccination to access non-essential services (such as restaurants and gyms).

Get proof of your COVID-19 vaccination by visiting yukon.ca/vaccine-proof or phoning **1-877-374-0425** any day from 7:30 AM to 8 PM.

Yukon government and health care workers are required to have their first vaccine dose by November 30, and their second by January 30.

HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS

Between **October 15 - November 30**, the Acting Chief Medical Officer of Health strongly recommends:

- avoiding non-essential services for **10 days** after you travel outside the Yukon if you are not fully vaccinated;
- limiting social gatherings to **20 people** indoors if everyone's fully vaccinated;
- limiting social gatherings to **6 people** if not everyone is fully vaccinated; and
- having an operational plan if you are a business; provide a service; or will be holding an event.

These recommendations are intended to minimize risk until new vaccination requirements come into effect on **November 30**.
